

# Global Health Course

## Clinical Tropical, Migrant & Travel Medicine

June 29, 2009 through August 21, 2009

Course attendees are welcome to participate on a weekly or monthly basis!

**AUDIENCE:** This is an intensive training course aimed at any physician or health care provider who works in immigrant, refugee, and travelers' health and tropical medicine. Based on the principle that there are no local diseases, emphasis is on the delivery of pragmatic information and skills for providing health care in a global village.

This certificate preparation course is one of 13 courses offered internationally, and the only course that is co-sponsored by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. It is accredited by the American Society of Tropical Medicine and Hygiene (ASTMH) and prepares participants to qualify for the biannually-offered exam that leads to a Certificate of Knowledge in Clinical Tropical Medicine and Travelers' Health.

Participants include practicing health care providers, UMN medical students, and local and national residents and fellows. The course also plays host to a large number of international faculty and physicians.

**COURSE:** Participants can take all or a portion of the Global Health Course, in any order, over multiple years. Continuing Medical Education credit hours are available to course participants.

**ACCREDITATION:** This activity has been approved for AMA PRA Category 1 Credit™. Determination of credit is pending.

This activity has been planned and implemented in accordance with the Essential Areas and Policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) through the joint sponsorship of the University of Minnesota and the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.
